National Registry

The largest alpaca organization in Canada is the Canadian Llama and Alpaca Association (CLAA). Incorporated under the Animal Pedigree Act, the CLAA seeks to address all things necessary to carry out the function of an animal pedigree association under the Animal Pedigree Act.

The CLAA aims to support the long-term development of a profitable camelid industry in Canada through the establishment of breed standards, the maintenance of pedigree records, and by providing a reliable and uniform system of registration for llamas and alpacas across Canada.

Not only does the CLAA maintain the national herdbook and pedigree information, it also preserves herd and ownership data, and helps the Industry promote ethical breeding practices while supporting the promotion initiatives focused on breed improvement.

By providing accurate national herd data through the registration of llamas and alpacas the CLAA works further with its breed divisions to support and establish breed improvement initiatives, and help provide education for the membership and public.
